Post-Treatment Care Information Sheet

NUMBING

- Usually lasts 2-4 hours

- Be careful not to bite your lip, tongue or cheek

- Soft foods while numb

- Avoid area worked on for 24 hours

WHEN UN-NUMB

- Make sure bite is **PERFECT**

- May need adjustment if:

** Your bite feels off or does not come together evenly

** Your mouth or jaw starts to get sore

- A bite adjustment is quick, free of charge, and requires no numbing

• MAY BE SORE FOR THE NEXT 24-48 HOURS

- Dr. Brya recommends anti-inflammatory 600mg (Ibuprofen, Motrin, or Advil) or Tylenol if unable to take the above

- Swish with a warm salt water rinse; It helps heal the gums quicker; They should be pink, firm and healthy within the next 2 days.
